Native American Heritage Month



November celebrates the rich and diverse cultures, traditions, histories and important contributions of Native Americans. Native American Heritage Month is also a great time to learn more about our tribes, and to raise a general awareness about the unique challenges Native people have faced both historically and in the present, as well as the ways in which tribal citizens have worked to conquer these challenges.

The first people that lived in what is now the Houston area were tribes like the Karankawa and the Akokisa. Artifacts were discovered in 2009 from the Akokisa tribe while excavating on Cypress Creek in Northwest Harris County. Tools, arrowheads, and pottery shards were found dating as far back as 8,100 B.C. These were the first "Texans" to meet European explorers with documented encounters with notable historical figures such as Cabeza de Vaca, and later Sam Houston.

Today, Houston is still home to over 70,000 people of Native American descent. The Houston Museum of Natural Science has a permanent exhibit showcasing "The First Americans", and Houston is also home to the Southern Apache Museum, which recently went <u>virtual</u>. Just outside of Houston's city limits near Lake Livingston is the <u>Alabama-Coushatta Reservation</u>, who hosts visitors year around for camping and special events.

In House District 137 Young Audiences of Houston and the Westchase District will host the Danza Azteca Splendor! at Woodchase Park. Artists from <u>Calmecac Indigenous Organization</u> will be present to interact with students of all ages. The event will be held on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>November 20th from 3-4 PM</u>, 3951 Woodchase Dr, Houston, TX 77042.

Federal Child Tax Credit


President Biden's American Rescue Plan increased the Child Tax Credit from \$2,000 per child to \$3,000 per child for children over the age of six and from \$2,000 to \$3,600 for children under the age of six, and raised the age limit from 16 to 17.

All working families will get the full credit if they make up to \$150,000 for a couple or \$112,500 for a family with a single parent (also called Head of Household). most families are automatically receiving monthly payments of \$250 or \$300 per child without having to take any action.

If you are not automatically receiving monthly Child Tax Credit payments, the deadline to sign up is **November 15.**

For those without a tax-return, there is a <u>non-filer sign-up tool</u> that is easy to use on a mobile phone and also available in Spanish. If you are eligible for the Child Tax Credit but don't sign up for advance monthly payments by the November 15 deadline, you can still claim the full credit of up to \$3,600 per child by filing your taxes next year.

Sharpstown Civic Association



Redistricting



Last month, the Texas Legislature concluded a special called session to finalize the redistricting process. After the completion of the census, the legislature is responsible for redrawing representative districts for the Texas House, Senate, and State Board of Education, as well as Texas Congressional districts for our federal delegation.

The maps have been redrawn and submitted to the Governor for final approval. Much of House District 137's borders will remain current, with the district expanding slightly to take into account our growing population.
