Important Dates

- February 5 – Last day to register to vote or change your address
- February 20 – First day to early vote in person
- February 23 – Last day to apply for a vote-by-mail-ballot
- March 1 – Last day to vote early in person
- March 5 – Election Day and vote-by-mail ballot receipt deadline

Update Your Name and/or Address Online

You may update your name and/or address online if you still live in the county in which you are currently registered to vote. If you have moved to a new county, it is necessary to re-register using the printed Voter Registration Application provided in the section above. Online name and/or address changes must be submitted by the 30th day before any election in which you desire to vote. Click the link below to submit your online name and/or address change.

Apply for a Ballot by Mail

Click [here](#) to request a ballot by mail, if you meet the requirements below.

To be eligible to vote early by mail in Texas, you must:

- Be 65 years or older
- Be sick or disabled
- Be out of the county on election day and during the period for early voting by personal appearance or • Be expected to give birth within three weeks before or after Election Day or
- Be confined in jail, but otherwise eligible

88th Legislative Session by the Numbers

- 2 riders on the state budget
- 46 individual pieces of legislation authored
- 97 additional pieces of legislation joint authored, co-authored, sponsored or co-sponsored
- 143 pieces of legislation that navigated through the 88th Legislature had the Lalani name on them
- 36 pieces of legislation sent to the Governor for signature
- 36 pieces signed by the Governor with effective dates
- 0 vetoes
