#### Eligibility

To be considered for a scholarship a student must meet **two of the four** academic criteria:

- 1) have graduated or be on track to graduate high school with the Distinguished Achievement Program or IB Program;
- 2) have a current high school GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale;
- 3) achieve a college readiness score of 1590 on the SAT or 23 on the ACT; and
- 4) be currently ranked at the top one-third of the student's high school graduating class.

To receive the scholarship award in the fall 2019 semester, the student:

- 1) must be accepted and enrolled as a freshman at a private or public institution of higher education in Texas;
- 2) be an ROTC member in good standing; and
- 3) enter into an agreement with the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB).
