Summer 2020 Legislative Update

Dear Neighbor,

As your state representative, I wanted to write and share important information with you about the resources our office can provide for you, your family, and all the neighbors in House District 115. For months, the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted each and every one of us in different ways.

After being elected in 2018, I did not expect a public health crisis to become a cornerstone of my first term. Throughout all of this, our team has been committed to helping everyone in HD 115. The "Shelter-In-Place" order has not halted any of our work. HD 115 staff has been working remotely to ensure that every constituent has access to their state representative and has helped many of them during the COVID-19 crisis. We have also been proactively reaching out to you in the district to check in and offer our services to help in any way the office can. In our conversations, we have seen a wide range of needs in the district. From simple questions of how to use SNAP benefits, to connecting individuals with the Texas Workforce Commission to resolve unemployment claims, we have seen it all.

When the next legislative session begins in January 2021, how the state of Texas continues to respond and recover from the pandemic will be a top priority. The crisis has exposed critical gaps in our state's infrastructure. We know that not everyone in our district could access emergency resources they needed during this crisis – whether that was due to a lack of access to testing and health care, difficulty processing and receiving small business loans, or timely responses to state agency requests on everything from rental assistance to unemployment benefits.

Additionally, in the next session the Legislature will be faced with the important process of redistricting. Members of the Texas House of Representatives will be charged with redrawing district lines for Texas House, Texas Senate, Texas State Board of Education, and Congressional seats based on the 2020 Census count. With so many important upcoming items, we need your voice and input to ensure that the

VOTE BY MAIL

Now more than ever, it is critical for eligible voters to utilize the early vote by mail option. Texans that are eligible to vote early by mail must be: 65 years or older; disabled; out of the county on election day and during early voting; or be confined in jail, but otherwise available.
