On Saturday, March 26, my staff joined me in hosting two very wonderful Town Hall Meetings in my district. Our first Town Hall was led by Humble ISD Superintendent, Dr. Guy Sconzo, at Kingwood High School. And our second was held at Newport Elementary School in Crosby and was led by Crosby ISD Superintendent, Dr. Keith Moore.

We didn't pause for long as we were back to work on Monday morning, preparing for my first bill to be on the House floor on Wednesday. It was an honor to be the first Freshman member to lay out a bill before the entire body. My Senior members razzed me a little bit, but my fellow Freshmen stood with me to ease the sting.

My Public Education and State Affairs committees went late into the evenings on Tuesday and Wednesday. We covered many topics and made some hard decisions, but did what is best for the State of Texas. Thursday brought about HB 4, the Supplemental Budget for 2011, and HB 275, which authorized the use of the Rainy Day Fund. We started early in the morning and covered more than 200 amendments between both bills. I supported the final versions of both bills. Today, we are debating CSHB 1, the appropriations bill, on the House Floor. It is a very trim budget and I support it, as well.

The second Town Hall was held at Newport Elementary in Crosby. Dr. Keith Moore, Crosby ISD Superintendent, and Mrs. Christy Covan, Newport Elementary Principal, hosted the event for us. We had about 30 folks come out to see us for this event, including my friend, Earl Boykin. I was happy to see him there. Again, we addressed many of the same issues, like education, health and human services and the budget. I also outlined my legislative agenda and discussed the fifteen bills I have filed and many others that I have coauthored.

The Town Halls were a huge success and I really enjoyed being back in the community to hear from my constituents. We will plan to host another Town Hall sometime later this year to give an update on everything that happened in Austin and will occur in the future for District 127.
