### Special Session...so far

It has been close to three weeks since Governor Perry called the legislature back into their prospective chambers to complete unfinished business from the 82nd Regular Session. His first call had the members back at work to address fiscal matters issues relating to the budget as it passed both Chambers, including measures allowing school districts to operate more efficiently, and issues relating to healthcare cost containment, including improvements to Medicaid services.

A few days into the session, he added several more issues to the call, including the Texas Windstorm Insurance Association and Congressional Redistricting. Then just last week, he added the federal Secure Communities Program and the abolishment of sanctuary cities to our list of items to address.

I am proud to report that through hard work and dedication, the House has already addressed many of these issues with our focus on completing all the items before the last day of the Special Session, June 29th. I will keep you updated as the items come back to our Chamber from the Senate.

In other news, Texas Monthly recently released their 10 Best and 10 Worst Legislators of the 82nd Session. The biennial list is issued by writer Paul Burka and this year it included some special awards. Specifically, he named me as the "Rookie of the Year". He said, "the former president of Humble ISD is self-assured, diligent, and willing and able to tackle tough issues. In a session fraught with partisanship, he made a point of working across the aisle." It is an honor to be given this title especially because of the large number of talented members in my class. With one of the biggest freshman classes in years, our class exudes intellect and drive and I am honored to serve with each of them.

Lastly, I am happy to announce that our district office will officially open in July. We are planning an Open House for constituents to come by and see our great space for Friday, July 15. This is the same day as the Keller-Williams Concert at Kings Harbor, where our office is located.
