
Remember, Election Day is this coming Tuesday. Early voting runs through tomorrow, so be sure to get out there and vote!

Election Information

Early Voting Ends **Today** (Nov. 3)
General Election is **Tuesday** (Nov. 7)

On this ballot, there are 7 proposed constitutional amendments. You can find a summary of each of the proposed amendments [on my website](#). 
Harris County residents who were misplaced by Hurricane Harvey must still vote in Harris County, unless they changed their voter registration after the storm and before the October 10, 2017 deadline. If you have been relocated due to Hurricane Harvey, please be sure to check out [this election FAQ](#) from the Harris County Clerk's office.

If you have any questions about any of the matters that are on your ballot, contact my Capitol office, as our District Office remains closed. My staff will be happy to help you understand the issues.

Additionally, if you have any problems while voting, or complaints about a polling location, please be sure to contact the Harris County Clerk, Election Division hotline at 713-755-6965.

Above all else, be sure to get out there and make your voice heard through voting. The elections process is the mechanism that ensures our democracy is representative of its citizens.

Select DPS Driver License Offices Open This Saturday To Issue Election Identification Certificates



The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) is reminding Texans in advance of the upcoming Nov. 7 election that Election Identification Certificates (EIC), which can be used for voting purposes, are available year-round at all Texas driver license offices. In an ongoing effort to ensure Texans have access to EICs, DPS is offering Saturday hours on Nov. 4 at select driver license offices to issue EICs.

Voters who do not possess and cannot reasonably obtain one of the seven forms of approved photo identification have additional options at the polls. Texans can obtain an EIC at:

- Any of the [more than 230 Texas driver license offices](#) during regular business hours throughout the year
- [Select driver license offices on Saturday](#), Nov. 4, from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. (EIC transactions only)
- [Alternate approved locations](#) issuing only EICs in select counties

One form of identification that can be used for voting purposes is an EIC. You may apply for an EIC at no charge. However, if you already have any of the following forms of identification, you are not eligible for an EIC:

- Texas driver license - unexpired
- Texas personal identification card - unexpired
- Concealed Handgun License (CHL) or License to Carry (LTC) - unexpired
- U.S. passport book or card - unexpired
- U.S. Military identification with photo - unexpired
- U.S. Citizenship Certificate or Certificate of Naturalization with photo

To apply for an EIC, applicants must visit one of the locations listed above and complete an [application for a Texas Election Identification Certificate \(DL-14C\)](#). (For the Spanish language version of the EIC application, see <http://www.dps.texas.gov/internetforms/forms/DL-14CS.pdf>).

To qualify for an EIC, an applicant must:

- * Bring documentation to verify [U.S. citizenship](#) and [Identity](#).
- * Be eligible to vote in Texas (Bring a valid voter registration card or submit a voter registration application through the Texas Department of Public Safety.)
- * Be a Texas resident
- * Be 17 years and 10 months or older

To avoid delays or complications, DPS urges potential applicants to make sure they have the necessary documentation before arriving at the office or alternate approved location.

The EIC receipt an individual receives will include their photo and can be used for voting purposes until the permanent card is delivered by mail.

The EIC is free of charge to qualifying applicants and is valid for six years. There is no expiration date for an EIC for citizens 70 years of age or older. The EIC can only be used for voting purposes and may not be used as personal identification.


Partnerships and Progress: A Unity of Effort to Clean Up Texas



Hurricane Harvey left a giant mess with a giant price tag. The whole community continues to pull together to perform a giant cleanup from one of the costliest disasters in state history.

Certain Non-Profits May Qualify for FEMA Disaster Assistance



FEMA

Nonprofit organizations that experienced damage or losses from Hurricane Harvey may apply for Federal Emergency Management Agency Public Assistance to help them get back to the business of helping others.

The FEMA Public Assistance program may reimburse for eligible expenses incurred before, during and after Hurricane Harvey on a cost-share basis.

Federal cost-share for all categories of Public Assistance (PA) is 90 percent of total eligible costs, except for assistance previously approved at 100 percent.

Only certain nonprofit organizations (PNPs) are eligible. If they provide critical services, such as education, utility, emergency or medical, they can apply directly to FEMA. Those that provide non-critical, essential services to the community must first apply for a low-interest loan from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). FEMA may pay for all eligible emergency work and the permanent work not covered by an SBA disaster loan.

Essential service providers include:

- Child care centers;
- Libraries, museums and zoos;
- Community centers;
- Disability advocacy and service providers;
- Homeless shelters and rehabilitation facilities;
- Social and human services organizations for children, youth and adults; and
- Senior citizen centers.
