Houston ISD Reopening

HISD Important Information

- ❖ Free COVID-19 Testing HISD will continue to provide free testing for COVID-19 in conjunction with the Houston Health Department. Those interested in taking advantage of this opportunity may call 832-393-4220 for an access code and directions to the nearest testing site. For more information, please visit the Houston Health Department website.
- ❖ Reopening Timeline Fall 2020 HISD will continue with the plan to open up schools and begin face-to-face instruction unless otherwise stated by the city. Parents who do not want their child to attend have the ability to opt out and continue virtual instruction for either the rest of the semester (through January 29) or entire school year (through June 11). - ❖ HISD Technology Hotline Online education comes with many difficulties. However, for all technology issues, HISD recommends calling their hotline for help. This service is available from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday-Friday and is available in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Arabic. Students and Parents are encouraged to call 713-556-4636.
- ❖ HISD Continues to Provide Meals HISD will continue to provide breakfast, lunch, snacks, and afterschool suppers in classrooms for students engaged in in-person learning. Curbside meals will be available for students enrolled in virtual learning (will need proof of enrollment such as student ID or report card). Employees will continue to accommodate student health, medical, and special dietary needs, as well as allergy concerns. Department employees will follow public health hygiene recommendations and enhance custodial cleaning and surface disinfection. ❖ In-person Instruction Timeline - YES Prep will begin in-person instruction with staggered grades. Below you can find a list of when each cohort (collection of grades) will begin. For more information please visit their website.

Beginning Tuesday, September 29:

Elementary students and limited number of students grades 6-12

Beginning Monday, October 5:

Students in transitional grades 6, 9 & 12

Beginning Tuesday, October 20:

- ❖ YES Prep Continues to Provide Meals YES Prep is committed to serving students free healthy meals via grab n' go breakfast and breakfast in the classroom, and will serve a hot lunch to students in their classrooms or socially distanced in the cafeteria. Curbside meals will also continue to be available for students who are enrolled in online at-home instruction and to all students 18 years or younger. Five days' worth of meals will be available every Monday each week at all non-partnership YES Prep school from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., until further notice and students or parents will be required to give their student's name and YES Prep ID number. Exercise your right to vote with **FREE round-trip service** to the polls on all METRO local bus, light-rail and METROLift paratransit service.

Houston METRO is providing complimentary trips to polling locations in our service area.

Voters can ride at no charge on METRORail, local buses, METRORapid and METROLift - voters only need to inform bus operators and/or fare inspectors they are going to, or returning from, the polls.

Patrons needing customized directions can map out their trip with the RideMETRO mobile app or on RideMETRO.org. For information on polling locations visit the Harris Votes website.
