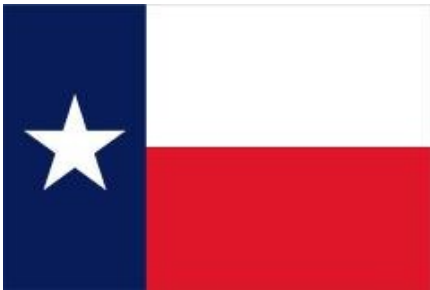

WHEREAS, Born on July 26, 1962, in Knox City, Russell Reynolds was the son of Nancy and Gerald Reynolds; after graduating from Quanah High School in 1980, he married the former Sherry Mowrey on July 31, 1982, and the couple were blessed with two cherished children, Brandon and Katy; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Reynolds studied pre-medicine at Tarrant County Junior College in Fort Worth and received his degree from the Texas Chiropractic College in Pasadena in 1985; he opened Reynolds Chiropractic Center in Comanche the following year and became a member of the Texas Chiropractic Association and the American Chiropractic Association; and
