Special Sessions Come To An End

January saw a break in the legislative action that took up almost all of 2023 and legislators have finally returned to their home districts to focus on personal lives and other local responsibilities that come with being a State Representative.

Although certain legislative issues have still not been resolved, it seems, at this time, that the Special Legislative Sessions have come to an end. If the Governor chooses to call another special session I will be certain to provide updates.

Select Health Care Reform Committee



Although the current Legislative Session has come to an end, that doesn't mean my work as Chairman of the Select Health Care Reform Committee has stopped. As Committees wait for their interim charges to be assigned, my staff and I have continued to meet with health care industry stakeholders and constituents to continue discussing some of the various issues that are impacting healthcare providers and patients.

Earlier this month I had the pleasure of touring Cole Health which is located on Deer Creek Drive in the district. This provided my staff and I a great opportunity to see up close the kind of life changing services that pediatric therapists provide our disabled children and the impact it has on them.

We also had the chance to sit down and discuss a few of the issues that are impacting pediatric therapy providers. This included low Medicaid and insurance reimbursement rates which is making it difficult for therapy programs to attract and retain therapists. This, along with other state-wide staffing shortages that have continued to grow since the COVID-19 pandemic, is resulting in network adequacy concerns and increasing waitlists for patients.

Low Income Housing Development

My office was recently made aware of a 9% Low Income Housing Tax Credit Application which would seek to be situated within the district between 249 and Cutten and would be called the *Birdseye at Cypress*.

Our community has expressed overwhelming opposition to these developments due to ongoing concerns over flooding, increased traffic congestion, overcrowding of schools and other concerns.

In the best interest of our community and to appropriately represent my constituents, I have submitted an official letter in opposition of this application to the Texas Department of Housing & Community Affairs.

The official swearing-in ceremony and organizational meeting for the Cypress Creek Drainage Improvement District was held on Wednesday, January 31, 2024, at the George H.W. Bush Community Center.

District Board met with Harris County Flood Control District Director and staff for the purpose of coordinating flood mitigation efforts going forward. Collaboration is mutually supported, and avenues are being developed to strengthen a joint effort on flood mitigation on Cypress Creek.



Cobalt Dreams: Unveiling the Beauty of Flow Blue

This exhibition, set up like someone's home invites you to step into the intriguing world of Flow Blue, a captivating style of porcelain and white earthenware whose origins, some argue, can be traced back to a serendipitous event in 1820s England. The general time period of collectible flow blue spans from the early time period of creation from the 1820s to the 1920s.

Imagine the allure of blurred blue glaze boldly contrasting with the radiant white background of

earthenware, a visual spectacle that ignites the passion of antique collectors. This unique expression of artistry emerged from the skilled hands of the Staffordshire potters, etching an enduring legacy through its intricate patterns.

Legend has it that the inception of "flow" blue china was a fortuitous accident—an abundance of chemical or glaze that caused the blue to bleed and blur onto the surrounding white canvas. And so, with this unintentional stroke of brilliance, a craze was born, forever cementing Flow Blue as a distinctive chapter in the annals of porcelain craftsmanship.

This Exhibition is open from January 26 – May 11, 2024 and is in the Rebecca Cole Gallery. The work is from the collection of Vivian Kromer.

We welcome and would like to introduce the latest addition of new field staff to ESD 11. All have spent two weeks training and learning how to provide the best pre-hospital care to the citizens in our community. We are proud of their commitment to following the Star Care Values (Safety, Team-Based Approach, Attention to Human Needs, Respect, Customer Accountability, Appropriateness, Reasonable Actions, and Ethical Behavior) that are the foundation of the ESD 11 Mobile Healthcare mission.

Chain of Survival

When suffering a Cardiac Arrest, one has less than 10% of a favorable outcome. To beat these odds, having a Chain of Survival is crucial. It begins with (1) early recognition of a cardiac arrest, (2) activating 911, (3) early CPR and defibrillation, followed by (4) comprehensive post-cardiac arrest care. While exercising at the local YMCA, Mr. Kenneth Coquyt collapsed and went into cardiac arrest. Because of the

quick actions of the staff by providing immediate CPR and using their AED, Mr. Coquyt is alive and well today. It was a privilege to meet these amazing people who used their CPR training to revive Mr. Coquyt and it is a reminder of how important the first Chain of Survival is.



IT'S TIME TO ADD "CLOSE YOUR DOOR" TO YOUR FIRE SAFETY CHECKLIST

You know how important it is to have working smoke alarms, escape plans, and a designated meeting place in case of a fire. But did you know that closing your doors in your home is also important for your safety? Closed doors can reduce fire growth, limit damage to your home, keep temperatures down, and can even save your life if you become trapped.

Because of synthetic materials, furniture and construction fire spreads faster than ever before.*

"NIST Technical Note 1455-1, February 2008



MAKE A 900 DEGREE DIFFERENCE - A closed door can mean reducing 1,000 degrees down to 100 degrees.



TAKE IT DOWN A NOTCH - During a fire, a closed door can keep carbon monoxide levels at 1,000 PPM versus 10,000 PPM if the door is left open.



TAKE A BREATHER - A fire needs oxygen to burn. A closed door keeps more oxygen in the room and away from the fire. When you exit a fire, make sure to close your door behind you to slow down its growth.



DOZE SAFELY - 50% of home fire deaths happen between 11pm and 7am. Closing your doors before you hit the hay helps keep you safe.

Close Before You Doze | Fact Sheet (From the Firefighter Safety Research Institute)

- 1. In this case, 100 beats 1,000: Using thermal imaging cameras, researchers found that closed-door rooms on both floors during the fire's spread had average temperatures of less
- 1 than 100 degrees Fahrenheit versus 1000+ degrees in the open-door rooms.
- 2. Carbon Monoxide is a killer: A bedroom with its door left open has about 10,000 PPM CO (parts per million of Carbon Monoxide), which is extremely toxic. A bedroom with a closed 2 door has approximately 100 PPM CO.
- 3. Fire is getting faster: 40 years ago, we had 17 minutes to escape our homes in the event of a fire. Today, due to synthetic materials, furniture, and construction, we now have 3 minutes 3 to escape our home.
- 4. Fire danger doesn't sleep: About half of home fire deaths result from fires reported 4 between 11 pm and 7 am, when most people are asleep.
- 5. Breathe easier: In closed door rooms, oxygen levels are at a breathable 18%, while open 5 door rooms oxygen levels are at 8%, which is extremely low.
- 6. Life or death: In experiments done by FSRI, a victim in the closed bedroom was survivable and able to function well through every experiment and well after fire department arrival. In the open bedroom, potential victims would be unconscious if not deceased prior to fire
- 6 department arrival or as a result of fire ventilation actions.
- 7. Slow down: A closed door can slow the spread of fire, reduce toxic smoke levels, improve oxygen levels and decrease temperatures dramatically – and that could make a life-saving

7 difference in your home.

- 8. Close the door when you're leaving: When exiting a burning structure, don't forget to close 8 the door! It will cut off the fire's oxygen supply and may stop the fire's growth.
- 9. Check those alarms monthly: It's important to take other safety precautions as well roughly 3 out of 5 deaths happen in homes with no working smoke alarms or no smoke 9 alarms at all .
- 10. Plan your escape: Having a fire escape plan for your home is also important to stay safe during a fire visit every room with your family and decide on a designated meeting spot at 10 the front of the house .
