I was also appointed Vice Chair of Appropriations subcommittee on Infrastructure, Resiliency & Invest Committee, a committee that will address our needs since Hurricane Harvey. I look forward to working with Appropriations Chairman John Zerwas and fellow members to create a budget that works for the people of Texas. Juvenile justice, CPS, mental health, and public schools are all areas that deserve our attention, and I am working to increase funding across the board for the children of this state.

I will also be serving on the Pensions, Investments, and Financial Services Committee for the first time this session and am grateful for the opportunity to ensure financial stability for Texans, especially our retired teachers and workforce.


