Texas House Committee Hearings on Redistricting




The House Committee on Redistricting recently met at Texas Southern University to inform Houstonians about the redistricting process and hear public testimony.

The Texas House Committee on Redistricting has been holding meetings across the state to inform the public about the importance of the upcoming 2020 census, and how getting an accurate population count will impact the redistricting process that will happen during the 2021 Texas legislative session. They recently met in Houston at Texas Southern University, and I was happy to be able to attend and make sure the committee is aware of the needs in House District 137.

These hearing also served as an opportunity for the committee to hear input from the public. It was great to see such passion and commitment to having a transparent process for my fellow Houstonians, who voiced the need for proper demographic representation, especially in our immigrant and under-represented communities.

Imelda Recovery Update



On October 4th, The President granted Governor Abbott's request that will provide individual assistance for those in Chambers, Harris, Jefferson, Liberty, Montgomery, and Orange counties. If you were affected by Topical Storm Imelda, you may be eligible for assistance.

The groundbreaking for a monument dedicated to former President Lyndon B. Johnson took place on October 17, 2019.

The statue will stand in Little Tranquility Park, near the Revention Music Center downtown, and will be surrounded by a wall featuring important quotes from LBJ during his time as President.

The project is scheduled to be completed in 2020.

November is National Veterans and Military Families month.


Since the end of WWI, we have celebrated our veterans in November, starting with Armistice Day. Armistice Day was in honor of the armistice signed by the Allies in WWI that took place on the "11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month". This November 11th marked the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day, November 11th, 1919.

Later renamed Veterans Day in 1954, Veterans Day sought to honor all current and former enlisted military personnel for their service. Today, we still celebrate Veterans Day on November 11th, but take the entire month of November to reflect and show our appreciation to our service men and women.

Texas REAL ID Information

REAL ID is a coordinated effort by states and the federal government to fight terrorism, identity theft, and other issues. **Beginning October 1, 2020**, only state-issued driver licenses and identification cards that are fully compliant with the REAL ID Act will be accepted for official federal government purposes, such as entering secure federal buildings or boarding domestic flights. Texas DPS has been reaching out to those customers whose driver license, commercial driver license, or identification card will expire after the October 2020 deadline in order to ensure that they have access to a REAL ID compliant card if they want one. If you are a Texas without a REAL ID, you have several options, based on the current expiration date of your DL or ID.
