Eviction Moratorium

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has issued a nation-wide temporary eviction moratorium for certain tenants through **July 31, 2021**. Additionally, the Texas Supreme Court has issued an order in support of the CDC's declared moratorium.



Updated Vaccine Information

<u>ALL</u> Texans (12 years old and up) are now eligible for the COVD-19 vaccine. Getting vaccinated for COVID-19 is <u>FREE</u>, and does not require proof of residency, citizenship or insurance. 

It's Hurricane Season

Hurricane season officially starts June 1, and lasts through Nov. 30, usually ramping up in August, and hitting a peak in mid-September. The Texas Hurricane Center offers these helpful tips to make a plan, be prepared and be ready at https://gov.texas.gov/hurricane.

- Put together an emergency supply kit. Watch a video on how to build a Go-Kit.
- Create a <u>communication plan</u> with your family.
- Sign up for your community or county warning system.
- Know <u>flood risks</u> in your area.
- Purchase or renew a <u>flood insurance policy</u>. Homeowners policies do not cover flooding. It typically takes up to 30 days for a policy to go into effect, so the time to buy is well before a disaster. Get flood coverage under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).
- Know your <u>evacuation routes</u>.
