Every home in the U.S. is eligible to order #4 free at-home COVID-19 tests. The tests are completely free. Orders will usually ship in 7-12 days and will be delivered by USPS.

Order your tests now so you have them when you need them. Click the image to be taken https://www.covidtests.gov/


The tests available for order:


- Are rapid antigen at-home tests, not PCR
- Can be taken anywhere
- Give results within 30 minutes (no lab dropoff required)

- Work whether or not you are up to date on your COVID-19 vaccines

Early Childhood Texas



The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS), working in partnership with several state agencies that also provide services to young children, is launching the Early Childhood Texas website.

It's a streamlined resource for Texas parents to find information about early childhood services available through the Texas Workforce Commission, Texas Education Agency, Texas Department of State Health Services, Texas Health and Human Services Commission, and DFPS. The new website, www.earlychildhood.texas.gov, serves as a one-stop-shop to connect Texas parents with access to a variety of free or low cost services and resources, available through different state agencies and different programs.

The Early Childhood Texas website offers Texans information and resources in the following areas:

- <u>Health & Development</u>: child development including resources for children with special needs, nutrition, health tips, and healthcare
- Parenting: child safety, parenting tips and support, at-home learning activities
- <u>Child Care & Education</u>: child care and after school programs, prekindergarten, Head Start and Early Childhood Special Education
- <u>Eligibility Programs:</u> state sponsored programs and assistance opportunities available to families of young children in Texas
