CURRENT LEGISLATION

Prior to the legislative session, Representative Muñoz filed three bills that, if passed, will positively impact District 36 and the entire state:

HB 391 establishes full-day Pre-Kindergarten classes for children currently eligible for half-day Pre-K programs.

HB 432 provides an exemption from property taxes for surviving spouses of veterans.

HJR 51 a constitutional amendment that supplies the foundation for HB 432 to be properly implemented.



Representative Muñoz is an avid supporter of public education and is committed to helping children receive the best education that this state can provide, starting with full day Pre-Kindergarten classes.
