



KEY BILLS FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION, RETIRED TEACHERS, AND VETERANS



Texas Legislature Passes HB 3, School Finance Reform Bill

HB 3 fundamentally transforms the way Texas invests in its students and makes school funding formulas more efficient and equitable.

HB 3 highlights:

- \$2 Billion for Teacher Pay Raises
- \$4.5 Billion for classroom
- Increases in state share of funding from 38% to 45%
- Base per-student funding increased
- from \$5,140 to \$6,160 • \$5 Billion in property tax relief



Texas Legislature Passes SB 12, TRS Contribution Legislation

The Texas legislature passed historic legislation that increases the state's contributions to the Teacher Retirement System of Texas (TRS).

SB 12 highlights:

- "13th check" one-time supplemental check for retirees.
- Increase in member contributions
- Increase in state's contribution from 6.8% of payroll to 8.25% by 2025

from 7.7% to 8.25% by 2025

- Increase in school district contributions from 1.5% to 2% by 2025
- Requirement that districts that pay into Social Security must also pay the district contribution



More than \$23.3M in Grants to 102 Veteran Programs

approved grant awards supporting 102 veterans assistance programs totaling \$23,340,000 from the TVC's Fund for Veterans' Assistance (FVA) 2019-2020 grant program. FVA grants have supported a wide range of services for veterans such as housing, food, financial aid, health care and job skills training. Since 2009, the TVC has awarded over \$114 million in grants to organizations,

TEXAS LEGISLATURE PASSES HB 1, \$250.7 BILLION BUDGET



As the 86th legislative session comes to a close, the hard work done by the Appropriations Committee is finally coming to fruition with the publication of the final version of the Texas budget. Representative Muñoz voted in support of HB 1, which accomplishes funding towards high priority items and will greatly benefit the state. Below are highlights of HB 1.

SB 500 SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS



Aside from the main appropriations bill, HB 1, the legislature also passed SB 500, a supplemental budget bill for items not covered in the original two-year budget.

\$589 million from the ESF for a one-time additional payment for retired educators, also known as a 13th check (SB 12).

\$100 million from the ESF for Disaster

\$15 million for hospitals. At least 40% must be used to fund hospitals in the RGV

\$5.5 million to Community Mental Health Crisis Services.

\$50 million from GR for a Rate Increase for Children's Hospitals.

\$47 million from the ESF for state flood risk maps and a state flood plan.

\$10.9 million from the ESF for the Post Disaster School Safety to provide a grant to any schools that experience a school

\$100 million from the ESF for additional appropriations for school hardening.

LEGISLATION CO/JOINT-AUTHORED BY REPRESENTATIVE MUÑOZ, JR.

Along with the bills Rep. Muñoz, Jr. authored, he also teamed up with colleagues to pass other key bills that improve the overall quality of life of the people of District 36 and the state as a whole. Below are highlights of these bills.

HB 1631

Rep. Muñoz co-authored this important legislation that prohibits the use of red light cameras. The bill prohibits a local authority from issuing a civil or criminal charge or citation for an offense or violation based on a recorded image produced by a photographic traffic signal enforcement system.

oint-authored by Rep. Muñoz, this measure seeks to establish the creation of a public law school in the Rio Grande Valley.

HB 103

HB 260

Rep. Muñoz joint-authored this legislation that creates a cross-border motor vehicle traffic congestion web portal meant to reduce delays and provide real-time information on traffic conditions and border wait times.

A measure joint-authored by Rep. Muñoz to create a criminal offense for the operation of a stash house and provides for the use of contraband seized in relation to that offense, making it easier for law enforcement to effectively prosecute criminal organizations that use stash houses to commit illegal activities.

HB 2613 BY: FRULLO

HB 4531

Legislation joint-authored by Rep. Muñoz to protect vulnerable adults from sexual assault and to aid in the prosecution and prevention of these offenses. The bill establishes a protocol by which health care facilities may provide a forensic medical examination and treatment

Rep. Muñoz co-authored a measure to develop a disaster recovery task force to operate throughout the long-term recovery period following natural and man-made disasters by providing specialized assistance for communities and individuals to address financial issues, available federal assistance programs, and recovery and resiliency planning to expedite local-level recovery efforts.

HB 6

SB 1017

Rep. Muñoz sponsored this legislation to create an advisory council on postsecondary education for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The advisory council will be tasked with developing educational outreach materials to raise awareness in Texas of postsecondary education opportunities for distributing them to all Texas public schools.
