On Wednesday, February 15th, marked Glioblastoma Day in memory of Jose Angel Martinez. His son, Jorge Martinez, was in attendance to accept the resolution on his behalf. Jose Angel was diagnosed with a grade 4 glioblastoma, an aggressive type of brain tumor that ultimately took his life. Seeking to achieve his version of the American dream, he raised a family of four, while making minimum wage for most of his adult life. He spent nearly 50 years working with the same farmer and teaching his 4 children, and 9 grandchildren about the values of hard work, self-reliance, and being a contributing member of society.
