### HB 2672 and HB 2678 Clear Hurdle

I am so proud to report three of the four bills I have introduced this session to fight

sexual misconduct have now passed out of committee! Two of these bills are aimed at increasing Texas' ability to study and understand sexual assault on a macro level.

You can't fix a problem if you can't study it. And with House Bills 2672 and 2678, we will have a more complete picture of the issue to help better understand why survivors of sexual violence aren't as likely to receive justice as victims of other crimes.

# Making Pipeline Operators Work with Local Officials



It's common sense:
There should be full and transparent communication between common carriers attempting to route a pipeline and the county governments it will impact. That way we can ensure the needs of each impacted community are met.

For instance, in our district, Kinder Morgan didn't reach out to our local elected officials until they had already chosen a route. But the company didn't have local on-the-ground information about planned developments, road reroutes, and the

counties' open space plans. Their maps even showed outdated city boundaries, and they skipped reaching out directly to at least one city where they're planning to build.

This is unacceptable, and with this legislation, we can remedy it this session.

The bill I laid out this week, HB 3327, would require pipeline operators with eminent domain authority to send a written notice of intent to county judges of the impacted counties before the operator contacts landowners.

Companies should know their full liabilities and have the ability to understand their siting prior to beginning the eminent domain process. With this bill, we'll create a faster and fairer procedure for all parties involved in the pipeline laying process.

### Passing My First Bill on the House Floor

I haven't done the research, but I'm pretty confident I am the first representative in Texas history whose freshman hazing involved the Jeopardy! theme song being played over the Texas House intercom.

My first bill, House Bill 4116, was officially passed out of the House this week. The bill provides communities pursuing water discharge permits more tools to negotiate agreements that work for everyone and will encourage more beneficial reuse.

# **Protecting Members of the Trans Community**



Transgender women of color face a higher rate of violence than any other group. It is past time we add prejudice based on gender identity to the hate crimes act so that all Texans can live free from violence and persecution. That's exactly what Rep. Garnett Coleman's HB 1513 would do.

I was proud to join with Rep. Coleman and fellow members of the LGBTQ and House Democratic Caucuses for a press conference in support of this bill.

### Fighting for Medical Marijuana and Decriminalization

### House Bill 63

I believe in Texas we should fully decriminalize cannabis. House Bill 63 by Rep. Joe Moody moves us in that direction, treats Texans more compassionately, and takes a critical step toward a fairer criminal justice system.



By passing this bill, we are reducing the penalties for those possessing small amounts of cannabis. The state of Texas arrests nearly 75,000 individuals each year for marijuana possession, one of the highest rates in the nation. An arrest for carrying small amounts of cannabis should not derail someone's life, make them lose their driver's license, or give them difficulty finding a job or housing.

Instead of harsh fines in the thousands and the possibility of jail time, HB 63 makes it so that possessing small amounts of marijuana may result in a fine not to exceed \$500 with no possibility of incarceration.



### House Bill 4145

Many patients, especially veterans and chronic pain patients, use marijuana to alleviate pain and relieve nausea or anxiety. That fact alone should not be grounds to discharge a patient.

Unfortunately, many physicians use urinary drug testing to deny prescriptions and even discharge patients when they discover their patients have used marijuana. So I laid out HB 4145 this week to protect access to care for patients, especially those with chronic pain and anxiety.

Recognizing the Texas Hill Country American Viticultural Area I am honored to represent part of the Hill Country at the Capitol and so proud to see the area continue to garner national attention and acclaim.



The wine industry, in particular, is a major contributor to the region's economic vitality and cultural vibrancy, and it deserves to be acknowledged and appreciated. That is why I introduced House Resolution 1402 recognizing the Texas Hill Country American Viticultural Area for its contributions to our state.

The Texas Hill Country AVA holds the 2nd highest rate of wine tourism in the entire nation. Next time you're shopping for wine, look for the "Texas Hill Country" label and you'll know your wine was grown using 85% Texas Hill Country AVA grapes!
