

Preparing Your College Application: Key Information You Need

When applying to colleges, you'll need to gather some basic information that almost all applications require. It's important to have these details ready:

- Name and Address: Essential for colleges to create your file and communicate with you.
- **Educational Information**: Be prepared to discuss your enrollment intentions, educational background, and academic goals. You'll need to list your high school and any colleges attended, along with the dates.
- **Standardized Tests**: Inform the colleges which standardized tests you plan to take or have taken, such as the SAT, ACT, or THEA, along with the scores if available.
- **Residency Information**: This determines if you qualify for in-state tuition, which can significantly affect your costs.
- Extracurricular Activities: Detail your talents, honors, community service, and employment history to give schools a full picture of who you are outside the classroom.
- **Essays**: Not all schools require essays, but for those that do, they can be crucial to your application. Get help from your counselor or teachers to ensure your essays are compelling.

Applying to Colleges as a Texan

Begin your application journey with two prominent platforms: **ApplyTexas** for state institutions and **CommonApp** for a broad range of colleges nationwide.

ApplyTexas Overview: ApplyTexas provides a unified application process for multiple public colleges and universities across Texas. The newly redesigned ApplyTexas portal, set to launch in May 2024, promises a user-friendly application experience.

Essential Steps:

- 1. **Create an ApplyTexas Profile**: Initiate your journey by registering an account on ApplyTexas. Explore and select from a diverse array of Texas colleges and universities that align with your academic interests and career aspirations.
- 2. **Assemble Necessary Documentation**: Prepare essential documents such as your high school transcript. These can be directly requested through the Texas Records Exchange (TREx) via ApplyTexas.
- 3. **Submit Your Applications**: Comply with the application deadlines for each chosen institution, utilizing the resources offered by ApplyTexas to facilitate your application process.

CommonApp Overview: Common App simplifies the college application process for over a million students annually, connecting applicants to more than 900 colleges globally.

Essential Steps:

- 1. **Establish Your Common App Profile**: Register on the Common App website. This profile allows you to present your academic records and extracurricular engagements, forming the foundational step in your college application journey.
- 2. **Collect Required Materials**: Accumulate essential documents such as transcripts and recommendation letters. Common App offers a comprehensive checklist tailored to the specific requirements of each college.
- 3. **Finalize and Submit Applications**: After completing your profile and customizing applications according to each college's requirements, thoroughly review your submissions and ensure they are submitted before the respective deadlines.

Navigating Financial Aid in Texas and Nationwide

Securing financial aid is crucial for managing college expenses effectively.

1. **Complete the FAFSA or TASFA**: Depending on your residency status, you could fill out either the **Free Application for Federal**

- <u>Student Aid (FAFSA)</u> or the <u>Texas Application for State</u> <u>Financial Aid (TASFA)</u> to access various forms of financial aid.
- 2. Explore State and Federal Grants: A list of known grants and scholarships
 - <u>Texas Educational Opportunity Grant Program (TEOG)</u>
 - <u>Toward EXcellence, Access, and Success Grant Program (TEXAS Grant)</u>
 - Tuition Equalization Grant Program (TEG)
 - Federal PELL Grant
 - Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant
 - <u>Federal Teacher Quality Enhancement Scholarships</u> from the U.S. Department of Education
 - Fifth Year Accounting Student Scholarship Program
 - Kenneth H. Ashworth Fellowship Program
 - Marine Corps Foundation Scholarship
 - National Health Service Corps (NHSC) Scholarship
 - Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program
 - Texas Public Educational Grant Program (TPEG)
- 3. Other Scholarships and Work-Study Opportunities: Utilize national resources such as <u>Fastweb</u> and the <u>College Board's</u> <u>BigFuture</u> to find other scholarships and work-study programs that can help offset educational costs.


